Re: Artificial intelligence education for the Australian health workforce

The Australian College of Nursing (ACN) would like to thank the University of Melbourne and the Australian Alliance for Artificial Intelligence in Healthcare for the opportunity to provide feedback via your online survey.

ACN recognises the increasing importance of artificial intelligence in health systems and services. ACN has thousands of members in every state and territory across Australia and we have promoted this consultation opportunity to them to respond to you directly.

ACN is a strong proponent of the National Digital Health Strategy and advocates for the role of nurses to optimise the adoption and ongoing use of information and technology to improve patient care and patient outcomes. ^{1 2 3} The role of nurses in the digital environment has the potential to not only deliver improvements in efficiency and patient outcomes, but also to facilitate improved consumer and clinician experience. ⁴

ACN has made submissions on numerous digital health consultations, including the *Health*Practitioner Regulation National Law (South Australia) (Telepharmacy) Amendment Bill 2020 and the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia consultation on the proposed regulatory amendments to support the continuing medicines practice of the Rural Isolated Practice Registered Nurse (RIPRN) role in Victoria. In the latter consultation, ACN welcomed the innovative and forward-thinking approach to provide for "future-focused models of practice".
